# THE BRYAN STEWART YOUTH SAILING MEMORIAL AWARDS LUNCHEON

Each year the Bryan Stewart Youth Sailing Memorial Awards Luncheon is held to honour Bryan Stewart who joined the Club in August of 1993 and unfortunately passed away in December 2019. He was not only a large contributor due to his mechanical mind and his willingness to help at the Cedar Island Yacht Club but was a huge supporter of Youth Sail. The Stewart family in recognition of Bryan and also Youth Sailing presents a cheque annually to Youth Sailing to be used to promote the program, usually by assisting a graduate to becoming an instructor. The luncheon is also held to recognize an individual(s) or group(s) for their extraordinary support for Youth Sailing. This year the Awards went to Glenn Lethbridge, Executive Director of Ontario Sailing and Paul Cairoli.



For the past 28 years Glenn has been the Executive Director of Ontario Sailing. That might be his title but in fact he is the heart, soul, voice and face of this great organization, Ontario Sailing. He has put untold hours into the development and growth of the sport of sail. Today sailing would not be where it is without him. Most important to Cedar Island Yacht Club is the great help and advice he gave to our Youth Sailing program. In fact without his passionate advice, we would never have gotten the program off the ground. The same story can be echoed by yacht clubs all across the Province who without Glenn's help their youth sailing programs would have never started.

Today Glenn, the man, not his organization is being honoured. In this Glenn's final year before retirement, we wish to acknowledge his great works. He has gone above and beyond any job description or role in an endless pursuit of youth sailing.



We can't say enough about Paul and his love for sailing and Youth Sailing in particular.

Paul joined CIYC less than 11 years ago. He came to us from Cook's Bay Yacht Club where he served as Commodore for several years. A year after joining CIYC, he became vice-commodore and worked with the commodore to establish CIYC's first ever Strategic Plan. Most recently Paul served on the Board of Directors of the Ontario Sailing Association giving us an edge on what was happening around the Province regarding Youth Sail.

Paul knew what it took to make a yacht club successful. As a business man he knew who to contact and how to get them involved.

Paul was instrumental in getting the Town of Kingsville involved and contacting businesses like Truax Lumber who donated lumber for the youth sailing docks built by members of our Committee. While docks were being built, Paul was smoozing with Glenn Lethbridge working out a deal to purchase used boats and a trailer from Ontario Sailing.

Through Paul's strong leadership, our Youth Sailing Committee continues to work cohesively supporting each other. Our Youth Sailing Program has been nothing but a success story. We have grown from a two week program to eight weeks. It will be a challenge to continue with the story without Paul's direct assistance. As Sue, one of the members of our committee said recently, "Paul is Youth Sailing". I think that sums things up quite nicely about Paul.



Not only did we have Justin (Bryan's son), Vicki Stewart (Bryan's wife) and Justin's wife and daughter (not in the picture) present, we had three levels of government (Federal, Provincial and Municipal) with us at the luncheon recognizing the contributions made by Paul and Glenn. Both Glenn and Paul were presented with a certificate from the House of Commons in recognition for their involvement and commitment to Youth Sailing.
